



Who we are

The French Association for Disaster Risk Prevention (AFPCNT) has been operating since 2001 in the field of disaster risk management.

The goal of the AFPCNT is to promote and develop a permanent, transverse and multirisk platform of stakeholders (individuals and organizations) involved in disaster risk reduction activities.

Our action, focused both on risk culture and resilience, aims to raise awareness among the people to prepare them to face natural and technological risks.

Since 2022, the AFPCNT is supported by the **French Ministry of Environnement**.



Development of disaster risk awareness

Specific action: Prépa'Risk 2nd edition - Spring and Fall 2024

A campaign of online risk management simulation exercises that allow municipalities to test their activation crisis units and backup plans in case of natural or technological disasters.

Specific action: Resilience Tour - September 19 to December 15 2024

To propose at each stage a range of awareness-raising, information, role-playing and training actions which converge towards a single objective: to prepare populations, communities and local officials to face risks, strengthen their abilities to act in the face of crisis situations and develop their adaptation capacities to enable them to be active players in their territory.

Action: Survey on the perception of risks amongst tourists and tourism industry professionals in France – August 2024



Conducting a survey to was to better understand the risks perceptions, attitudes and needs of tourists and mountain tourism professionals. The survey was conducted on field in the North French Alps and via Meta and LinkedIn.

80% of respondents know that they are exposed to natural and technological risks in this mountain territory

58% of tourists say they are aware of behaviour in the event

The majority of respondents rate the effectiveness of communication tools to inform them between 5 and 7 out of 10.

Build Back Better

Specific action: Franco-Italian round table "Building Back Better around the seismic risk"

A workgroup co-led by the AFPCNT and AFPS that aims to develop a shared vision and a post-earthquake "Build Back Better" frame of reference common to the AFPCNT - AFPS with a multi-disciplinary territorial approach based on feedback from embodied experience in the territories, documenting long histories and the interweaving of the various organizational, technical, social, economic and other dimensions...

Scientific actions

Specific action: Scientific webinars

From March 25 to July 1, AFPCNT organized a series of webinars entitled "Les Rendez-vous du conseilcientifique"/"The Scientific Council meeting". The aim was to create a dynamic that encourages members of the Scientific Advisory Board to take part and lead these meetings.

Overseas actions

Specific action: Awareness-raising villages in La Reunion Island

and Mayotte

AFPCNT organized two awareness-raising days on natural and technological risks, with a traveling village on September and October through numerous educational activities to help them prepare and share their experiences of these risks: production of a survival kit, knowledge of hazards, mapping, etc. These actions have been implemented in collaboration with many partners BRGM, DEALM, Naturalistes de Mayotte, PIROI, Mtsamboro municipality...

Actions: Bilateral cooperation
