As a reminder, the « Phase 1 » report is a stocktaking exercise on the International Day for Disaster Reduction on 13 October. It presents the international context of the emergence of this day as well as the main actions carried out at national, European and international levels as part of this event. This report was published in March 2022.

This « phase 2 » report sets out proposals for actions to be deployed in French territory and recommendations made by the AFPCNT to contribute to greater influence, awareness and increased performance of the 13th of October.

After a reminder of the proposals made by the Courant mission¹, in the ministerial plan (Ecology)² “Resilient in the face of hazards”, within the Ministry of the Interior’s draft orien-

tation³ and programming bill and in Law 2022-217 of 21 February on differentiation, law on decentralisation⁴, deconcentration and various measures to simplify regional public action, the report presents the contribution that the AFPCNT proposes to make in conjunction with its partners and regional actors.

Beyond the internal reflections of the association, the AFPCNT’s proposals have been built from a series of interviews with some of the key players in disaster hazard reduction and prevention role in disaster hazard reduction and prevention.

With regard to their field of action and experience, various representatives of associations, local authorities, manufacturers, citizens and government departments were interviewed in order to:

- identify the actions envisaged at their level ;
- collect their expectations of the International Day and of the AFPCNT ;
- and benefit from their critical views on the AFPCNT’s proposals.

The time available for this report limited the number of interviews and meetings. Further interviews with other stakeholders will be carried out during 2022. They will help to enrich the current proposals and recommendations and to optimise the 2023 action plan for the 13th of October.

Similarly, the **webinar of 3 May 2022** organised by the « Inondation Arc Méditerranéen » Interregional Mission (MIAM), in collaboration with AFPCNT members and partners and with the support

of Cyprès, made it possible to open the discussion on some key topics (e.g. « hazard » points of contact or flash training exercises mentioned in the report) and thus to further refine the AFPCNT's proposals and recommendations for the 13th of October.



The AFPCNT wishes to initiate actions to help raise awareness of the International Day for Disaster Reduction on 13 October and mobilise around this day.

The actions envisaged by the AFPCNT are in line with the roadmap for its mandate for the next four years. The proposed actions aim to:

- increase awareness of the day itself ;
- identify and respond to the expectations of the population and the territorial actors around this day ;
- promote the actions carried out by local actors in connection with this event ;
- encourage local actors in all French regions (including overseas) to organise events on the ground around this day ;
- carry out actions useful to the regions ;
- determine and optimise the performance of the day by developing a culture of resilience.

For the 2022 edition of the 13th of October, AFPCNT's target audience will be the general public. This priority target will be supplemented by other targets in subsequent years (e.g. industrialists, economic activities and organisations, traders, etc.). Actions aimed at targets other than the general public may nevertheless be undertaken during the 2022 edition. **Regional decision-makers and hazard managers may constitute an « indirect target »** since the organisation and implementation of the 13th of October event will be the responsibility of the decentralised State services, local authorities, associations and competent professionals.



The International Day for Disaster Reduction is a national, annual, unifying and mobilising event. While it takes place every year on 13 October, it should be noted that **the actions identified in this report could be organised over several days and thus form part of a week to raise awareness among and acclimatise the public to natural and technological hazards or more broadly the resilience to major hazards.** This format would make it possible to reach several types of audience at different times of the week: the general public but also more specialised audiences (school-children, families, residents, elected representatives, professionals, industrialists, etc.). It would even be appropriate to **be designed to be implemented throughout the year.**



It already appears that **capitalisation and promotion** (at international, national and local levels) of **existing and future actions in France** as part of the preparations for the 13th of October is an essential first field of work. **Guidance and support** with the development of new projects in this framework as well as **the AFPCNT's own management** of certain actions could also constitute objectives of the future associative project.

Finally, **the performance measurement of the actions** carried out in terms of hazard culture development and **the opinion of the target audiences** on the actions carried out will be essential.

Indicators will make it possible to measure the awareness and the unifying and involving nature of the events organised. They will also be used to **optimise the action plan over the following years** with a view to continuous improvement.
